ABOUT GEF

Guruji Education Foundation (GEF) is a registered trust, which works with underprivileged students to enable their holistic education, and thus provide them with a more equitable access to opportunities and success. As part of its mission of “Education for All”, GEF provides support for holistic education of underprivileged students, based on the principles of:

- Inclusivity
- Quality over quantity
- Cycle of giving
- Customized career planning
- Holistic development
- Collaboration

GEF runs 2 broad flagship programs:

i) Holistic Higher Education (HHE), where high-potential college students from underprivileged sections are identified to catalyze their all-round development by providing them with resources that they may need. The resources could include interest-free loans (to be paid after they start earning), personal mentoring, career counselling and more

ii) Adolescent Development Program (ADP), which aims at enabling schools, especially those catering to underprivileged children, to provide holistic education spanning physical literacy, psychological strength, intellectual prowess, life skills, and entrepreneurial thinking

GEF accords special attention towards education of students from a distressed backgrounds including orphans, single parent families, and families impacted by cancer, covid etc. More than academic brilliance, the emphasis is on providing these students an education that is appropriate to their abilities and can help them in getting meaningful employment.

THE QUARTER IN A NUTSHELL

As we step into the new financial year 2026-27, we are pleased to share the Quarterly Report for the January - February - March 2026 quarter.

As reported in the Highlights in the next section, this has been a busy and eventful quarter - both in terms of activities carried out during the quarter, and also what we have been able to achieve. As GEF continues to grow, apart from the growing funding requirements, we are deeply cognizant of the need to work towards further strengthening our processes and systems, and also build the required human capacity. This is amply reflected in the Highlights - be it the Guidestar certification, or our collaboration with SVP, or the musical concert for fund raising.

The quarter also saw the Winter Scratch Day 2026 being held to mark the culmination of Winter Scratch Festival. And then of course, were the Annual Days across all major centres, which amply showcased our students' management and organisational skills, in addition to their creativity and talent.

We are marking the end of the financial year 2025-26, with 76 schools and institutions in our Adolescent Development Program (ADP) network, which is in line with our target of 75 for 2025-26. The count of students currently being supported under our Holistic Higher Education (HHE) program is 176, which is slightly short of our target of 200 for 2025-26.

Guidestar follows a rigorous assessment model based on which it certifies NPOs at 5 levels - Bronze, Bronze+, Silver, Gold, and Platinum.

After due consideration to various factors, GEF had applied for the Foundation Level - Bronze Certification. We are pleased to share that after a thorough evaluation of our compliances and processes, GEF has been accorded the Foundation Level - Bronze Certification.

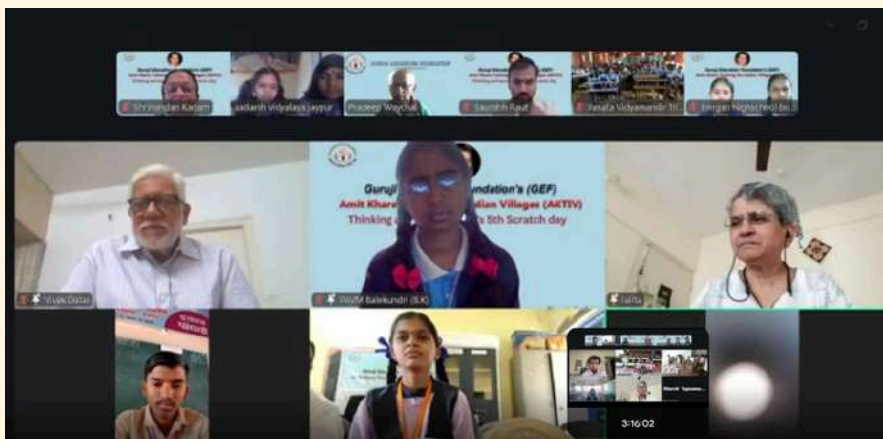

Winter Scratch Day 2026

With over 1300 students participating online, the Winter SCRATCH Festival held by Guruji Education Foundation (GEF) was proof of the Foundation's success in implementation of technology driven learning and problem solving among school children

Prof. Vivek Datar, Nuclear Physicist, former Raja Ramanna Fellow and former Project Director, INO, alongwith Mr. Prashant Nori, an alumnus of the prestigious Harvard Graduate School of Education, Creative Head at Wayground, Ed-tech innovator and former team member of SCRATCH Foundation were the chief guests for the online event held on February 14, 2026.

Appreciating the efforts of rural and semi-urban schools in adopting digital learning platforms, Prof. Datar encouraged students to use SCRATCH not only as a coding platform but also as a tool for creative thinking and structured problem solving. He spoke about how creativity combined with logic developed confidence in young learners and emphasised the importance of platforms like SCRATCH which empower students to become creators, and not just consumers of technology.

Sakshi is currently in the 3rd year of her Integrated BA+LLB program at ILS Law College, Pune.

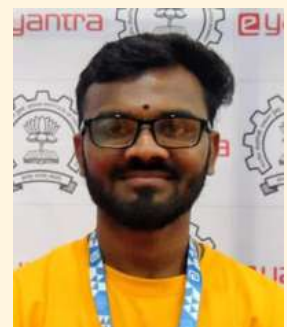

Here is an early version of an article by Dr, Pradeep Waychal titled “Development of a Child’s Brain”, to be soon published in external media

We all know that human beings have a highly developed brain. However, in most cases, child’s brain does not develop to their full potential. Parents and other elders must know that they can influence the brain development of their child. This can be right from the time the child is in the mother’s womb till it becomes an adult. Before understanding how to do this, let us know a little about our brain.

The brain broadly has three parts. The first is the **reptilian or primitive brain**, which controls basic life functions such as breathing and heartbeat. The second is the **amygdala**, which is the emotional centre. It creates quick emotional reactions like fear, anger, and excitement— before consulting the thinking brain i.e., the **frontal cortex**. This part helps us think, plan, and make decisions. This thinking part of the brain has two sides. The left side helps with logic and analysis, and the right side supports creativity and the expression of emotions.

In a fully developed brain, all these parts must work together. This is called a **whole-brain approach**. It means there is a balance between instinct, emotions, and thinking. When this balance develops, child learns to respond thoughtfully instead of reacting impulsively. We are presenting some ideas to do that. These are from the book “**The Whole-Brain Child**” by **Daniel Siegel** and **Tina Bryson**.

When a child is young, it is mostly guided by emotions. So, when a child feels angry, sad, or upset, it is not useful to explain things logically. First, we must understand and accept the child’s emotions. A parent can say, “I understand you are upset,” and offer comfort through a hug or gentle touch. This helps the child feel safe and calm. After that, it becomes easier to use a logical approach.

For example, if Anushka is upset because her friend Savi cannot come to play with her, the parent should first comfort her as explained above. After she feels better, the parent can gently suggest other options, such as playing with another friend or playing with Savi the next day. When emotions settle, child can think and handle situations better.

The thinking part of the brain becomes stronger with use. That is why child should be given opportunities to make decisions from an early age. A young child can make simple decisions, such as what to wear for an outing or which cup to use for drinking milk. As they grow, they can be presented more difficult situations. For example, what will they do, if they find a toy in the park or if they see someone being troubled. Such opportunities develop child's thinking abilities. The child may make mistakes. That is a part of learning and should be accepted. Activities like games, puzzles, and sudoku can improve thinking skills, too. Our education system does not focus on developing thinking ability, which must be compensated.

Memory development is another important aspect. It also improves with practice. Parents can support this by playing memory games, talking about the child's day, and discussing past experiences. Looking at family photo albums and asking child what they remember about the photographed event also strengthens memory.

A happy and friendly family environment plays an important role in developing brain. When relationships are warm and supportive, child feels secure. Spending enjoyable time together—talking, playing, laughing, traveling, or watching movies—helps build strong emotional bonds.

Raising a child has, obviously, its challenges. However, each challenge can be seen as an opportunity to help the child grow; to develop emotional strength, balance, and empathy. That immensely benefits both the child and parents.
